Wayne National Forest Ranger Station is a 15,000 square foot administrative headquarters for the forest service. The program included offices, conference rooms, The design intent for the exterior is to replicate the "coal tipple", a building form prevalent in the area. The interior design called for the use of natural materials, inviting the exterior into the interior, typical of most forest service buildings. The wood frame building features salvage brick, masonry, corrugated metal, and a standing seam metal roof. The salvaged brick is also a prominent interior feature, and enhanced by rough stone flooring and wood species native to the area. Bogden Architects developed the construction documentation for the building, and full interior design services.
